Our secretary and facilitator, Wilfried-Willy Dautlich wants you to believe that this is he. No really, although he swam for 'Team Austria' back in the 50's.

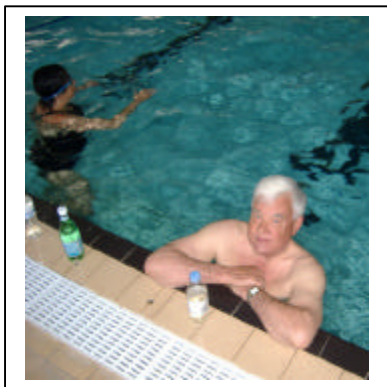
He didn't feel too well on the day and did his **one-hour** swim, on his own, on the 1st July, clocking up 90 lengths.



Our good friend **Sarah set herself a personal goal of 2 miles: that's 25 meters lengths 128 times!**

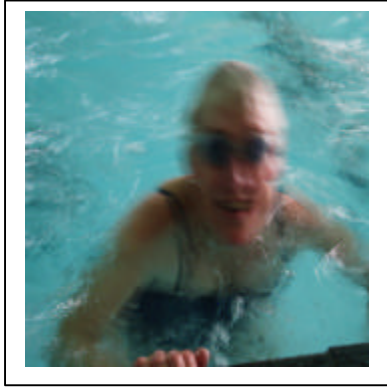
How did she achieve it?
